D. REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS – Dr. William J. Swart

Sarah Kaszubski gave the student liaison report.

Congratulations to John Hogan on his new position as Superintendent of West Hempstead.

The budget is currently a 4.99% budget increase and projected tax levy increase of 4.95%. Difference between proposed and contingency budget is approximately \$ 460,000, which translates to 1% of total budget. If budget passes, it will cost taxpayers about an additional \$96.00 per household as compared to contingency budget.

Rumors of class size increase and sixth grade enrollment were addressed.

The Middle School Best Practices Committee will make recommendations for changes in the middle school philosophy and programs and present to the Board by December 2007.

June 25, 26, & 27, there will be a Summer Institute planned for our educators. Topics will be presented by members of the Tennessee State Education Dept. and will include how to use data to add value to each student's educational achievement.

Monday, April 23, will be the first meeting relative to the Dowling College/Elwood UFSD Articulation Agreement. That agreement will provide our teachers with the opportunity to pursue graduate study on campus leading to a certification in education administration.
