REPORT FROM STUDENT LIASION – Vickie Cangero

There is a change in venue for the Girls Varsity Basketball game. It will be held at Longwood High School on Friday, March 10 at 5:00 p.m. The team will play Wantagh for the Long Island Championship. If our girls win the game, they will go on to the State Championships. Please come out and support the team.

Winter sports had a successful season. The Boys Basketball Varsity Team coached by Mr. Robbins had a strong season, 18-3. They lost to East Hampton in the playoffs. Mike Carlucci and Mike Castellano are Suffolk County Champions in Wrestling. Gabriella Baiter came in second for Triple Jump in the NY State Track Championships. The Boys Track Team 4x400 were State Champions. The relay team members are Emile Barnett, Cliff Faulkner, Carlton Wildman and Billy Miltenberg. Congratulations to all of our athletes!

The Student Council Teacher of the Month went to the High School Physical Education Teachers: Ms. Ott, Mrs. Byers, Mr. Brocking, and Mr. Shanahan. These teachers helped to organize one of the most successful Volleyball-a-thons ever. They raised over \$5,700! The money will be delivered to the American Red Cross and the Long Island Epileptic Association. These teachers have been role models, mentors, and friends, and they demonstrate what teaching is all about. Vickie presented them with certificates. D. <u>REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS</u> – Dr. William J. Swart Every one was welcomed at the meeting and in particular the National Junior Honor Society Middle School students. The audience gave the students a round of applause.

He is delighted with some of our instructional initiatives. Our Teachers Academy will operate in the spring, with over 50 teachers enrolled for staff development. The topic will be Technology in the Classroom. This project involves Elwood teachers teaching other teachers. He believes this type of internal-driven staff development will be very productive. Enhancing professional development and activities for educators is part of our Strategic Plan. We are proud this segment is in place.

This week we filed a request for proposal with Senator Carl Marcellino's office. We asked for a grant of \$50,000 to be used for additional staff development for teachers to create a Teachers Center. He thanked Mrs. Trucios, Mrs. Stephens (the ETA President) and Mr. Annucci (the Assistant Superintendent for Personnel). He believes we have an excellent probability of receiving this grant.

Our Leadership Assessment Committee meets on a regular basis. He believes our teachers and our administrators will develop for Elwood our own version of Value Added Assessment. He is excited they are working on that project.

Congratulations to the Boys 4x4 Relay Track Team for winning the New York State Championship. He wishes our Girls Varsity Basketball Team well tomorrow evening and hopes they will be successful in winning the Long Island Championship.

Later in the year we will honor our three National Merit semi-finalists, because they have now become National Merit finalists. It is an amazing accomplishment.

Dr. Swart read the following statement:

Our Board of Education members are elected by the community and serve on an unpaid, volunteer basis. They provide endless hours of service weekly. The members of this Board of Education are above reproach. Let me clearly indicate that:

- no Board member has violated his or her oath of office;
- no Board of Education member has abused his or her position on this Board or otherwise;
- no Board of Education member has done anything illegal.

I do not intend to include in the correspondence section of Board of Education Business Meetings any letters that are critical of individual members of the Board of Education. I will not tolerate any attack or criticism of an individual Board of Education member during the public commentary section of our business meetings. I will immediately terminate any commentary that I believe is intended to attack or criticize an individual Board of Education member.

Let me indicate that I believe that any previous attack on a Board of Education member was unjustified and unwarranted.

I also want members of our Board of Education to address each other with civility. I expect at all times courteous and polite interactions between and among members of our Board of Education, and I include myself, because I'm an ex officio member of the Board of Education

In summary, I believe personal attacks upon members of the Board of Education are unproductive and irrelevant. A Board of Education needs by definition to operate as a whole entity. An attempt to attack or defame one member is in my opinion an attack upon all of us. **E.** <u>COMMENDATIONS</u> – Tonight we honor three outstanding students:

Tara Linitz, was the recipient of the American Association of University Women's Excellence in Science Award. In addition to all of her talents, Tara was just accepted at Cornell University.
