D. <u>**REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS** – Michael A. Maina Welcomed those present and wished the entire community a Happy New Year.</u>

Regarding the State Budget: The Governor's "State of the State" address didn't reveal any specifics concerning school aid for '03-'04. Mr. Pataki did indicate that his detailed 2003-2004 budget proposal will be presented on Jan. 29. He stated that, "We will spend less money than last year and with the exception of public security, no segment of the budget will be exempt." The Administration will look closely at the impact of the Governor's proposal.

As announced at the December meeting, Elwood was awarded a New York State Education Grant to institute a program in grades K-5 for the Prevention of Child Abduction. Special training for all teachers and auxiliary personnel commenced yesterday. To raise awareness for our parents, we have scheduled an evening workshop on Wednesday, January 22, at 8:00 p.m. in the Harley Avenue cafeteria. All members of the community are also invited to attend.

Tonight's Agenda has been revised:

Only a portion of the transportation bid will be awarded.

Discussion -- <u>Item "A"</u> -- the award of bids for renovation and reconstruction of athletic fields will be moved to tonight's Superintendent's Report.

New Business - Item "G" - "Property Tax Exemptions for Certain Individuals".

The resolution changes to income levels are "routine".

There has also been a change to the Real Property Tax Law (New Section 466-C) which now permits towns, counties and school districts the option to exempt a small amount of taxes paid by volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers. The Board will seek comments on this matter at the next meeting and vote accordingly.

The Enrollment Report from Western Suffolk BOCES will arrive by the week of Jan. 18. A tentative work session may be held on Jan. 23 to review enrollment projections.

Discussion Item "A":

Award of bid for renovation and reconstruction of athletic fields and site work:

The athletic fields of the Middle School and High School were discussed at the Jan. 3 work session. To seed or to sod the fields is the question before the Board. If we seed, we will need two growing seasons. If we sod, we can use the fields in the fall. Sodding is more costly. However, if we seed we will need to pay transportation cost to bus the athletes to off-site facilities.

Lighting of the tennis courts was addressed. However, we must be concerned with the residents who live in the area surrounding the courts, as well as security and liability issues.

Further discussion of additional materials submitted by Sullivan & Nickel, Baldassano Group, and Cameron Engineering and their representatives was held. Work is slated to begin over the Feb. break.
