- b. Mr. Kaszubski moved and Mrs. Annunziata seconded that the Board approve the Committee on Special Education's recommendations for students'classifications/placements and/or discontinuance of services dated: November 6; November 13; November 20. The motion carried unanimously.
- c. Mr. Kaszubski moved and Mr. Cameron seconded that the Board approve (TAB P) the Committee on Preschool Special Education's recommendations for students' classifications/placements and/or discontinuance of services dated: *November 7.* The motion carried unanimously.
- d. Mr. Kaszubski moved and Mrs. Annunziata seconded that the Board (TAB Q) approve the list of AV and computer equipment from Elwood-John Glenn High School as obsolete and to be discarded. The motion carried unanimously.

#### 2. DISCUSSION ITEMS

Mrs. Annunziata suggested giving the state another month or two to implement their new 3 day fingerprinting technology. If there is no significant change, she will follow up with a draft letter to our elected officials.

Mr. Fraser contacted Mrs. Cardillo re obsolete computer equipment. She has not replied. The BOCES Tech program for computer repairs will be contacted by Mr. Fraser to see if they are interested in our obsolete equipment.

Mr. Cameron reported on Oak Wood Dairy's desire to increase milk production and its request to the Town of Huntington's ZBA for re zoning. He noted ramifications to the high school such as odors, increased noise, truck traffic, and the possibility of cutting through the high school entrance due to traffic back ups on Elwood road. Mr. Kaszubski and Mr. Maina will draft a letter to the ZBA for Board review.

The DeLea property was very briefly discussed.

A work session re site renovations will take place on January 2 at EMS 7:30 p.m.

Mr. Fraser reported that work on the Boyd auditorium is scheduled for completion by the end of December. Delays were caused by the late arrival of the windows from the manufacturer, thereby causing manpower and material rescheduling. There is no bid out to install air conditioning. However, the auditorium is equipped with duct work.

The Board members wished the community Happy Holidays.
