Also, checks for administrators and other staff exceeding \$500 must be signed by the District Treasurer and either the Deputy Treasurer or the Superintendent. Checks drawn on activity funds shall require any two of the following signatures: Superintendent, appropriate faculty advisor, appropriate central activity fund treasurer or school district treasurer.
